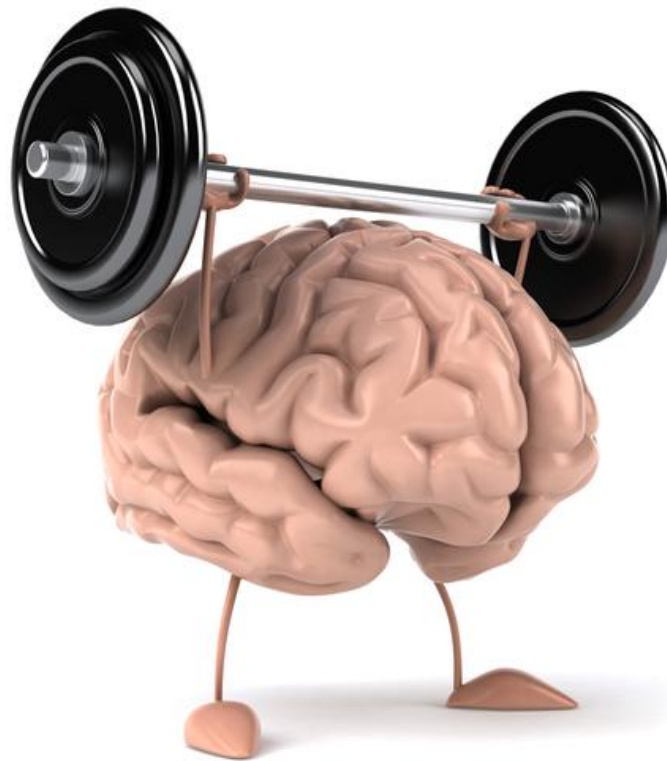

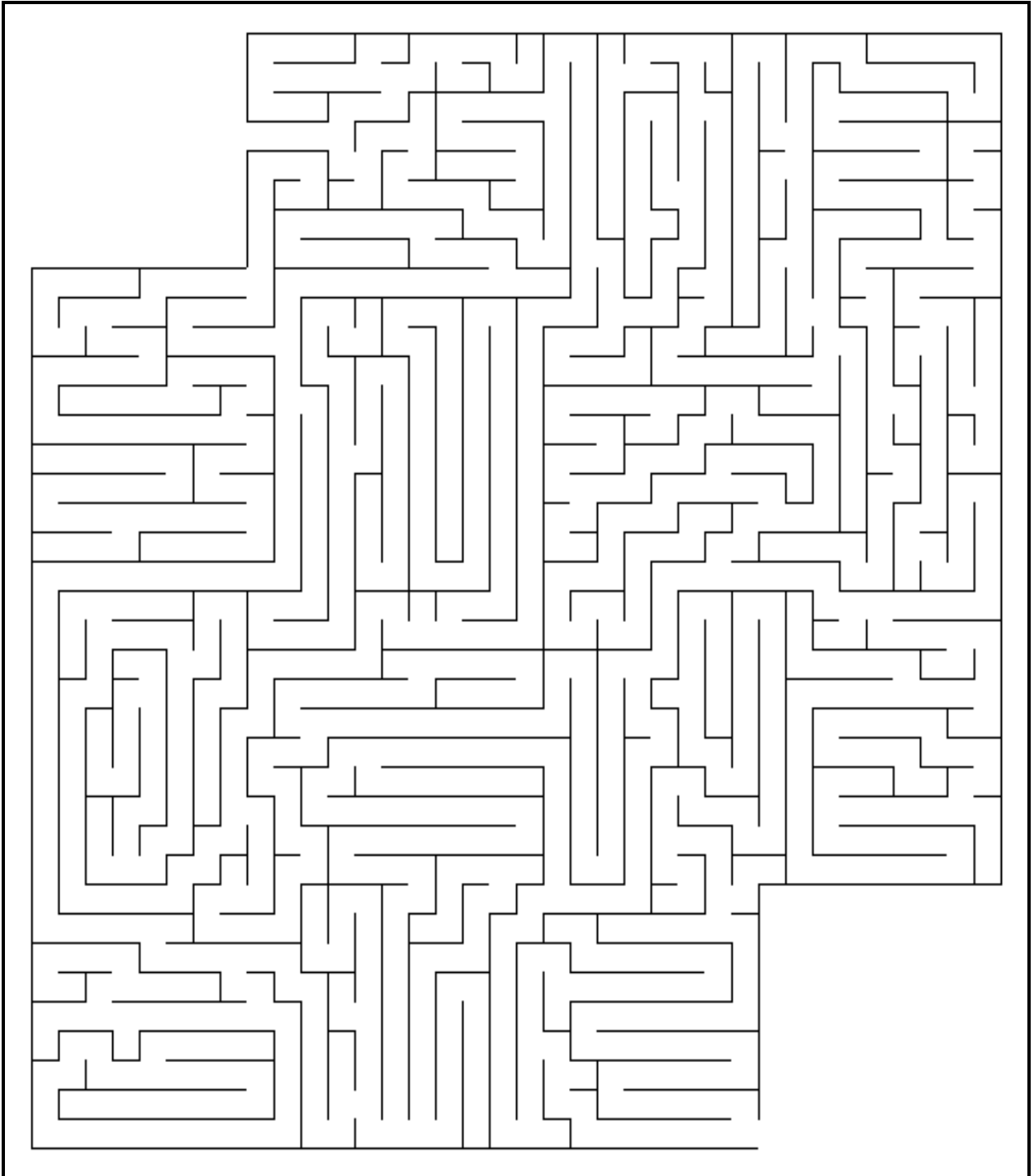

Logic Puzzle

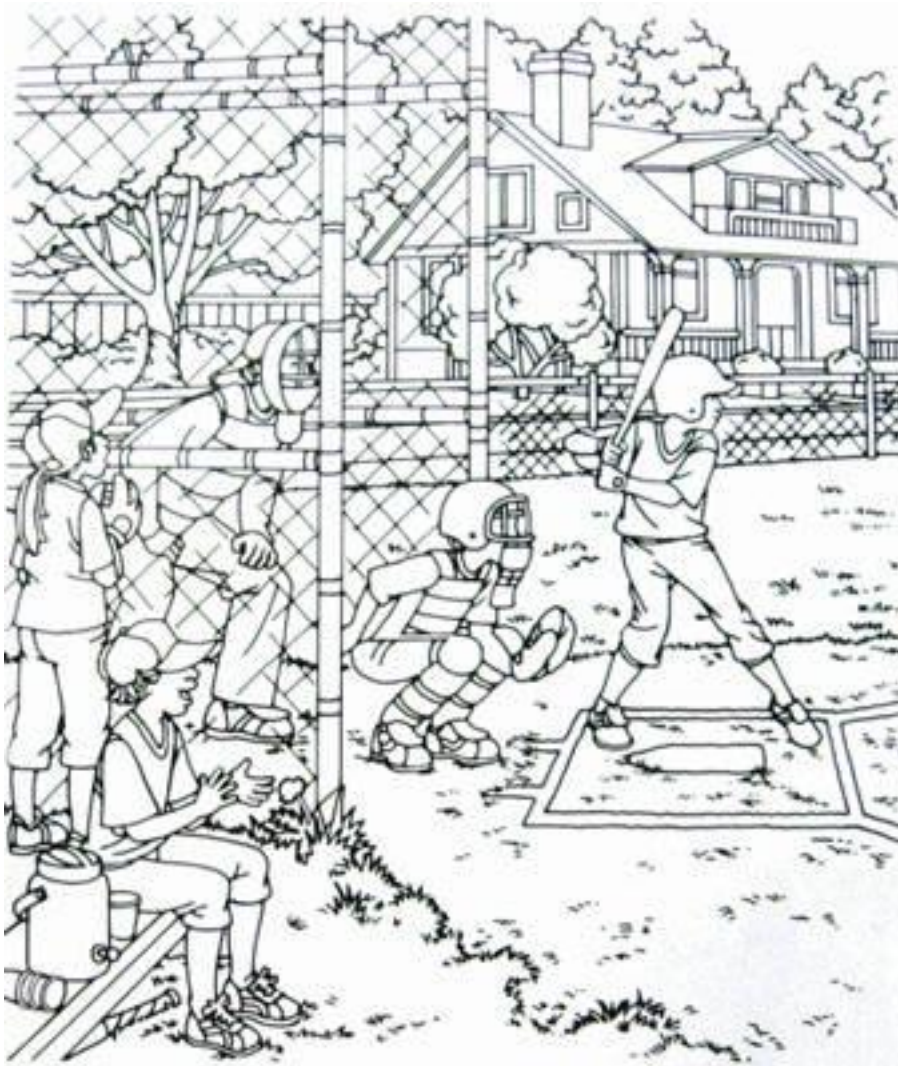

Narrative Memory

In the flat, low-laying coastal plain of Liberty County in Southeast Texas, Davis Hill State Park stands out as quite a landmark. It was formed by an underground salt dome, deep in the earth, pushing up the overlying layers of sedimentary rock, creating a hill that raises 200 feet above the surrounding Trinity River floodplain. The hill weathered as it rose, but it is still the most prominent topographic landmark in this part of the state.

Within this park, which measures less than 3 square miles in area, cypress-tupelo swamps rub shoulders with sandy prairies, and deep, fern-lined ravines flow into flat, slow-moving bayous. So far, biologists have found 800 plant species, including 40 considered rare.

The hill is named for General James Davis, a veteran of the War of 1812. He came to Texas with his family from Alabama in 1834 and settled in the area. He was a friend of Sam Houston and served as field officer of the Army of the Republic, and was also a member of the 1848 Texas delegation to Washington. In about 1843, he began a plantation at Davis Hill which he called Lake Creek, a name stemming from the fact that Davis Bayou may have been dammed on the property to create a lake.
